Athletics Information Regarding Athlete Registration for the 2024-2025 School Year

Starting in July, registration for athletes and marching band members will be **EXCLUSIVELY** online. A link is posted on our athletic website, festusathletics.com, that parents and guardians can use to register and add their student's information. The annual paperwork that is due every school year is there to be filled out and new updated physical forms can be uploaded by parents/guardians here as well, eliminating any paper copies being needed or turned in. Just as in previous years this registration **MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE** your student will be eligible for participation for the 24/25 school year. The software we will be using is **PRIVIT** and your information will be able to be completed on your computer, tablet, mobile or any device connected to the internet. This software is separate from Infinite Campus which is our student information system used for registration for the school year.

If your student-athlete still needs a physical to participate in marching band or athletics for the 2024-2025 school year, the District will host two more physical clinics on Tuesday, July 23 and Thursday, July 25. Details and links to the sign-up page can be found on the District website: www.festus.k12.mo.us. NO COACHES WILL ACCEPT PHYSICALS OR ANY PAPERWORK FROM ATHLETES.

High school practices/tryouts (Cross Country, Football, Volleyball, Boys Soccer, and Softball) will start on August 12th which is the first allowable practice day by MSHSAA for high school. Middle school practices/tryouts (Cross Country, Football, Volleyball) will start on August 19th which is the first allowable practice day by MSHSAA for middle school. Watch the District website and fest-sathletics.com for specific times and locations of practices. Athletes will need to have their physical packets filled out in PRIVIT before they will be allowed to practice.

**Physicals are valid for 2 years (730 days) from the date of issue, per MSHSAA guidelines unless the doctor requires a yearly physical. If an athlete has an approved physical (call to check physical date 636-937-5946), the athlete will still have to fill out the remainder of the Athletic Packet in PRIVIT EVERY SCHOOL YEAR.

ATHLETIC PASSES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

The Festus Board of Education will provide passes to the district's senior citizens, 65 years and older, for all non-tournament, home athletic games. You may obtain a senior pass at the Roy D. Burnside Administrative Building, 1515 Mid-Meadow Lane from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

EMERGENCY CANCELLATION

Weather conditions and other emergencies occasionally lead to the cancellation or an early release of school. SCHOOL MEALS THAT ROCK!

All families will need to complete a Free & Reduced Meal Application. The district has an electronic version of that form and all parents will have access via Parent Portal. Once you login to the Parent Portal you will see a yellow highlighted bar indicating an eForm is available. Simply click on that link and complete the form. We strongly encourage parents to fill out the free and reduced applications. Parent Portal will also give families access to their child's food service account and the on-line payment option. Food Service questions should be directed to the Food Service Department at 636-937-7747 and questions related to completing the Free and Reduced eForm can be directed to Nicole Gurnow at 636-933-9847.

Breakfast will be available to all students on the first day of school. School menus can be viewed on the school website at www.festus.k12.mo.us. The lunch periods are closed at all schools. For safety reasons, no student is allowed off campus. Cafeterias will serve students who qualify under federal guidelines for free or reduced meals. Should a student decide to bring a lunch, milk may be purchased in the cafeteria for \$.50 per half-pint. Meal charging is limited. Charging of Ala Carte items is **not** permitted.

A school lunch tray always has age appropriate portions and includes a healthy balance from five-food groups (fruit, vegetable, grains, protein and milk). Let's work together to encourage children to fill their lunch tray following the MyPlate guidelines: Make half your plate fruits and vegetables; always choose whole grains; switch to fat-free or low-fat 1% milk.

2024-2025 MISSOURI SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

- All students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status, including month, day, and year of each immunization before attending school.
- The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) allows a 4-day grace period. Students in all grade levels may receive immunizations up to four days before the due date.
- Missouri-required immunizations should be administered according to the current ACIP schedule, including all spacing, (CDC.Gov/vaccines/schedules).
- To remain in school, students "in progress" must have an Immunizations In Progress form (Imm.P.14) on file. In progress means that a child has begun the vaccine series and has an appointment for the next dose. This appointment must be kept and an updated record provided to the school. If the appointment is not kept, the child is no longer in progress and is noncompliant. (i.e., Hep B vaccine series was started but the child is not yet eligible to receive the next dose in the series.)
- Religious (Imm.P.11A) and Medical (Imm.P.12) exemptions are allowed. The appropriate exemption form must be on file. Unimmunized children are subject to exclusion from school when outbreaks of vaccine preventable diseases occur.

- 1. Last dose on or after the fourth birthday and the last dose of pediatric pertussis before the seventh birthday. Maximum needed: six doses.
- 2. 8-12 Grades: Tdap, which contains pertussis vaccine, is required.
- 3. Grade 8-11: One dose of MCV is required. Dose must be given after 10 years of age. Grade 12: Two doses of MCV are required unless the first dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose is required. At least one dose must be given after 16 years of age.
- 4. Kindergarten-12 Grade: Last dose must be administered on or after the fourth birthday. The interval between the next-to-last and last dose should be at least six months
- 5. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age. If MMR and Varicella are not administered on the same day, they must be at least 28 days apart. The 4-day grace period does not apply to live vaccines.
- 6. There must be at least four weeks between dose one and two; at least 8 weeks between dose two and three; at least 16 weeks between doses one and three and final dose must be given no earlier than 24 weeks of age.
- 7. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age. If Varicella and MMR are not administered on the same day, they must be at least 28 days apart. The 4-day grace period does not apply to live vaccines. Kindergarten-12 Grade: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a licensed health care provider may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.

EARLY CHILDHOOD (Pre-K)

<u>TINY TIGERS ACADEMY</u>: 1 bottle washable squeeze glue; 1 pair of child-sized, rounded-tip scissors; 1 pk. of pencils (5-8 pencils); 1 pack washable watercolor paint with brush set; watercolor paint tray and brush (set of 8 colors); 2 packages of coffee filters (used for snack time!); 1 box of gallon size ziplock bags; Full-sized backpack (The book bag or backpack must be large enough to hold a regular folder, as well as a change of clothes. No wheeled bags. EC will provide a communication folder for each child.); Change of clothes (Always provide a change of clothing in your child's book bag or tote in case of accidents. This includes shirts, pants, underwear or pull-ups, socks and shoes. Remember to label all of your child's clothing.) **WISHLIST** (optional) Donations of the following items are GREATLY appreciated: Boxes of tissues, baby wipes, disinfecting wipes, 100 small disposable cups, paper towels, play dough, coffee filters, treasure box items (small toys or candy).
